

Timesheets Due

Timesheets are due in the office on or before January 7th.

For those serving a medical hospice client (CHCS; Beacon; or Northern Light) please submit your timesheets by January 2nd so I can complete and submit it to them on time. Thank you! You may submit either the paper form or the online version via the PTH website.

Direct Care:

IF you are providing direct care to a client on medical hospice, Please try to get your paperwork to me by Tuesday morning (Jan 3rd) so I can do proper updates for the IDT meetings.

Remember, IF you serve a client who dies or is discharged from PTH services, your final timesheets must be turned in to the office within five (5) days of the death/discharge.

Indirect Care:

Your indirect care timesheets may be turned in quarterly, if that is easier for you than submitting them monthly.
